SIR,—Circumstances have induced me to reconsider that part of Lord Stanley's General Instructions of 7th March, 1842, which direct that the Half Salary of an Officer absent from his duties for the last half of the leave of absence originally granted to him, should not be paid until after his return to the Colony.

I find that since that Rule was established, almost every Officer who has been absent on leave in this Country, has applied for a relaxation of it in his favor, and has been able to allege such circumstances as to induce the Secretary of State to comply with the application. I infer from this that the Rule has been found either not to answer its purpose, or to effect that purpose at the expense of too much inconvenience and embarrassment to individuals, as compared with any advantage attending it, to warrant its being carried practically into operation. But as it appears to me very undesirable that a Rule of this description should be maintained nominally, after it has become in reality a dead letter, I have decided on abolishing it, and allowing an Officer absent on leave in this Country to receive here his Half Salary for the whole period of that leave, as it may from time to time become due; at the same time, the other Instructions contained in Lord Stanley's Despatch of 7th March, 1842, and all other Regulations established to prevent abuse in the application for, or grant of, leave of absence, are to be considered as in full force.

## GOVERNMENT NOTICE.

**R**EGULATIONS for the disposal of Timber and Lumber, under the 5th Section of the Act, 8th Wm. 4, cap. 1:—

1st. After the 15th day of August next, all applications for License of Grounds remaining unsold from the July sales, shall be made by Petition, which shall describe the situation of the ground, and specify the number of Square Miles required by the applicant. No Petition to be for more than ten, nor less than two Square Miles.

2d. One application only to be received at the Surveyor General's Office for the same ground.

3d. Every applicant on filing his Petition, shall deposit with the Receiver General the sum of ten shillings upon each Square Mile applied for, and should the party so depositing become the purchaser at Auction, such deposit shall be applied toward the payment of the purchase money. And in case the ground so applied for, shall not be purchased at the time advertised for the sale thereof, the deposit so made shall be forfeited; and in case some other person than the depositor, shall become the purchaser, and comply with the terms of sale, the amount so deposited shall be forthwith refunded to the party who may have paid the same.

A description Ticket, as heretofore will be given to the purchaser.

4th. All Berths applied for shall, if vacant, be advertised in the Royal Gazette, semi-monthly, and at least fourteen days notice of sale given; and unless the whole of the purchase money be paid by
