**W**HEREAS the Lieutenant Governor of Her Majesty's Province of New Brunswick, with the Council and Assembly of the said Province, did, in the month of March, 1845, pass an Act which has been transmitted, entitled as follows, viz:—

No. 1533. An Act relating to certain Fees.

And Whereas the said Act has been referred to the Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council, appointed for the consideration of all matters relating to Trade and Foreign Plantations, and the said Committee have reported as their opinion to Her Majesty, that the said Act should receive Her Majesty's special confirmation; Her Majesty was thereupon this day pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to declare Her special confirmation of the said Act, and the same is hereby specially confirmed, ratified and finally enacted accordingly: Whereof the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Commander in Chief for the time being, of Her Majesty's Province of New Brunswick, and all other Persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

## ANNO OCTAVO VICTORIÆ REGINÆ.

### CAP. CX.

An Act relating to certain Fees.

Passed 27th March 1845.

**‘W**HEREAS there are certain Fees paid into the Office of the Secretary and Registrar of the Province for Marriage Licences, Commissions, Warrants, and other services performed in the said Office, a portion of which, being that part of the said Fees due to the Administrator of the Government, has since the enactment of the Law for the support of the Civil Government of this Province, been paid over to the Receiver General of this Province: And whereas it is desirable, that the Salary of the Secretary, Registrar and Clerk of the Crown in Chancery, should be fixed, and that all Fees received by him by virtue of any office he may hold, should be paid over to the Receiver General for the public use, and the Salary he receives from the Civil List should be in lieu of all Fees or emoluments whatever;’

I. Be it therefore enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council and Assembly, That from and after the passing of this Act, all Fees payable to or receivable by the Secretary of this Province for any public service, act, matter or thing done by him by virtue of the office of Secretary, Registrar or Clerk of the Crown in Chancery, shall be received by him and deemed and accounted as part of the Public Revenue of this Province, and by him paid over to the Receiver General of the Province in the manner hereinafter provided.

II. Be it enacted, That it shall be the duty of the Secretary of the Province quarterly on the thirty first day of December, March, and thirtieth days of June and September, in each and every year, to pay over to the Receiver General of

Fees receivable by the Provincial Secretary, Registrar and Clerk of the Crown in Chancery, to be collected and paid over to the Receiver General as part of the Public Revenue.

Fees to be paid over quarterly, and accounts of particulars rendered.
