the Province, for the public use, all such Fees as he shall have received since the last preceding quarter, together with a detailed account or return thereof, specifying the particular services for which such Fees have been paid; a copy of which return shall be kept filed in the Office of the said Secretary, for the purpose of being laid before the House of Assembly at the then or next Session of the Legislature.

Act may be amended during the present Session.

III. And be it enacted, That this Act may be amended during this Session of the Legislature.

Act suspended until Her Majesty's approbation be declared.

IV. And be it enacted, That this Act shall not be in force until Her Majesty's Royal approbation be thereunto had and declared.

This Act was specially confirmed, ratified and finally enacted by an Order of Her Majesty in Council, dated the 27th day of August 1846.
