A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS it appears from an Inquest held before William Bayard, Esq., Coroner of our Lady the Queen for the City of Saint John, on the first day of February instant, on the body of a new born Female Child, then and there lying dead, that some person or persons unknown, did feloniously make an assault on the said child, being alive, and did then and there strike, bruise and beat the head of the said child, and did then and there thereby feloniously, wilfully, and of malice aforethought, cause the death of the said child:

I do therefore publish this Proclamation, and do hereby offer a Reward of Fifty Pounds to whomsoever shall give such information as may lead to apprehension and conviction of the Offender.

To all to whom these presents shall come,—GREETING:

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS Her Majesty by Her Letters Patent under Her Seal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland,

bearing date at Westminster, the first day of October, in the tenth year of Her Reign, has been graciously pleased to constitute and appoint me to be Governor General of British North America, and Captain General and Governor in Chief in and over each of the Provinces of Canada, Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, and in and over the Island of Prince Edward, and Vice-Admiral of the same, with all and every the powers and authorities in the said Letters Patent contained, and which belong to the said Office; I have therefore, with the advice of Her Majesty's Executive Council for the Province of Canada, thought fit to issue this Proclamation to make known the said appointment. I do also hereby, and with the same advice, require and command that all and singular Her Majesty's Officers and Ministers in the said Province of Canada, do continue in the execution of their several and respective offices, places and employments, and that Her Majesty's loving subjects, and all others whom it may concern, do take notice thereof and govern themselves accordingly.

Given under my Hand and Seal at Montreal, this thirtieth day of January, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty seven, and in the tenth year of Her Majesty's Reign.
