**YORK GENERAL SESSIONS OF THE PEACE.**

WHEREAS it hath come to the knowledge of this Court that Typhus Fever and other contagious and fatal diseases have been introduced into several of the Sea Ports of this Province by the numerous arrival of Emigrants: And whereas it is apprehended that diseased persons and families may escape the vigilance of the Health Officers and other authorities in the said Sea Ports, and find their way into the interior of the country, it is deemed highly expedient and necessary that precautionary measures, so far as are practicable, should be adopted, in order to arrest the progress and abate the virulence of those dreadful diseases, in the event of their extending to this City:

Therefore Ordered,

That a particular and careful inspection of the whole City be made from time to time by the Magistrates, accompanied by one or more of the special Constables, and that their utmost exertions be employed to have all nuisances abated, and to see that the most perfect cleanliness and good order and sobriety be observed and maintained by the inhabitants; and in order to the more effectual accomplishment of this object, it is further Ordered,

That this City be divided into five Districts, and placed under the particular supervision of the following Magistrates, viz:—

Smythe Street to Westmorland Street,—Messrs. Justices Bedell and Robertson.

Westmorland Street to York Street,—Messrs. Justices Hartt and Pickard.

York Street to Regent Street,—Messrs. Justices Taylor and Coy.

Regent Street to Saint John Street,—Messrs. Justices Wolhaupter and Hayne.

Saint John Street downwards,—Messrs. Justices Saunders and Minchin.
