## A BILL

To authorize Her Majesty's Justices of the Peace of the County of Westmorland to make provision for the payment of the County Contingencies.

WHEREAS the local Revenues of the County of Westmorland have been found insufficient to meet the annual expenditure of the said County;

Be it therefore enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council and Assembly, That from and after the passing of this Act, it shall and may be lawful for Her Majesty's Justices of the Peace of the said County, at any General Sessions of the Peace of the said County, to be thereafter holden, annually to make and order an assessment on the inhabitants of the said County, for such sum as they in their discretion shall see fit, not exceeding the sum of — in any one year, for the purpose of providing for the annual Contingent Expenses of the said County; such sum to be assessed, levied, collected and paid, agreeably to any Act now or hereafter to be in force for the assessing, collecting and levying of County Rates.

## A BILL

To authorize Her Majesty's Justices of the Peace of the County of Albert to make provision for the payment of the County Contingencies.

WHEREAS the local Revenues of the County of Albert have been found insufficient to meet the annual expenditure of the said County;

WHEREAS by an order bearing date the sixth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and forty five, pursuant to the Act of Assembly, intituled "An Act to afford relief to persons unfortunate in business in certain cases," made upon the Petition of the said Humphrey Shephard, setting forth a statement of his affairs as therein particularly detailed, it was ordered that the Clerk of the Peace for the said County of York, should call a public meeting of the Creditors of the said Petitioner, to be holden on the first day of July then next, for the purpose of enabling the said Petitioner to make terms with his Creditors and to render an exposition of his affairs; and whereas it appears by the return of the Clerk of the Peace, that a meeting was held pursuant to the said order, and that an arrangement was entered into between the said Petitioner and his Creditors, but in consequence of its not appearing upon the said return that due proof of the notice required by Law had been made before the said Clerk of the Peace, no order for the discharge of the Petitioner can be made therein; now upon the presentment of a further Petition of the said Humphrey Shephard, reciting the above circumstances, it is ordered that the Clerk of the Peace for the said County of York do call a public meeting of the Creditors of the said Humphrey Shephard, to be holden at the Office of the said Clerk of the Peace at Fredericton, in the said County, on the third day of March next, at eleven of the clock in the forenoon, for the purpose of enabling the said Petitioner to offer a composition to or make terms with his Creditors, and to render an exposition of his affairs.
