A BILL

To extend the provisions of "An Act to continue an Act, intituled *An Act for the appointment of Firewards in the Parish of Woodstock*," to the Bend of the Petitcodiac, in the County of Westmorland.

WHEREAS it is deemed expedient and necessary that provision should be made for the appointment of Firewards, and the better extinguishment of Fires at the Bend of the Petitcodiac, in the County of Westmorland;

I. Be it therefore enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council and Assembly, That for the purposes of this Act, the Bend of the Petitcodiac, shall be deemed and taken to include and comprise the following Land or District, viz: Commencing at the North of Jonathan's Creek, thence running North four miles, thence running East three miles, thence running South to the River Petitcodiac, thence following the said River to the place of begining.

II. And be it enacted, That from and after the passing of this Bill, an Act made and passed in the eighth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "*An Act to continue an Act, intituled An Act for the appointment of Firewards in the Parish of Woodstock*," and all the provisions thereof, be and the same are hereby extended to the Bend of the Petitcodiac, in the County of Westmorland.
