A PROCLAMATION.

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME OR MAY CONCERN :

KNOW YE, that under and by virtue of the power and authority in me vested in and by an Act of Parliament made and passed in the fifth and sixth years of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act for regulating the Carriage of Passengers in Merchant Vessels," I do hereby declare by Proclamation, that the said Act, and every part thereof, except as therein excepted, shall apply and is hereby extended and applied to the carriage of Passengers by Sea from this Province of New Brunswick to any Port or Ports, place or places within the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland.

Given under my Hand and Seal at Fredericton, in this Province of New Brunswick, the fourth day of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty seven, and in the eleventh year of Her Majesty's Reign.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS it appears by an Inquest held before Peter C. Amiraux and Vital Thibideau, Esquires, two of Her Majesty's Justices of the Peace for the County of Carleton, on view of the

body of Douglas Balloch, deceased, that the said Douglas Balloch came to his death by the discharge of a Gun, loaded with Gunpowder, a Leaden Bullet, some Buck-shot and Duck-shot, on the night of the eleventh of October last, fired off by some person or persons unknown; I do therefore publish this Proclamation, and do hereby offer a Reward of One Hundred Pounds to whosoever shall give such information to Her Majesty's Attorney General, of the person or persons by whom the offence was committed, as will enable him to prosecute the Offender or Offenders to conviction.
