Downing Street, 1st January, 1847.

Sir, -Four Acts passed by the Council and Assembly of New Brunswick, in the months of March, 1845, and April, 1846, and reserved by you for signification of Her Majesty's pleasure, having been referred by the Queen in Council to the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade and Foreign Plantations, that Committee have reported to Her Majesty their opinion that the said Acts should be specially confirmed and finally enacted.

I have the honor to transmit to you herewith the Order of Her Majesty in Council, dated 19th December, 1846, approving that

PRESENT: The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty, His Royal Highness Prince ALBERT, Lord President, Lord John Russell,

THEREAS the Lieutenant Governor of Her Majesty's Province of New Brunswick, with the Council and Assembly of the said Province, did in the months of March, 1845, and April, 1846, pass four Acts which have been transmitted, entitled as follows, viz:-

No. 1539. An Act to amend the Charter of Kings' College. No. 1644. An Act to Incorporate the New Brunswick Railway Company.

No. 1645. An Act to facilitate the making of a Railway from the City of Saint John, through Fredericton and Woodstock, to the Grand Falls of the River Saint John, and from thence to the Boundary Line of the Province of Canada, by the New Brunswick Railway Company.

No. 1646. An Act to amend an Act, entitled "An Act to amend the Charter of King's College.

And Whereas the said Acts have been referred to the Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council, appointed for the consideration of all matters relating to Trade and Foreign Plantations, and the said Committee have reported as their opinion to Her Majesty, that the said Acts should receive Her Majesty's special confirmation; Her Majesty was thereupon this day pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to declare Her special confirmation of the said Acts, and the same are hereby specially confirmed, ratified, and finally enacted accordingly: Whereof the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Commander in Chief for the time being, of Her Majesty's Province of New Brunswick, and all other Persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

An Act to amend the Charter of King's College.

Passed 27th March 1845.

THEREAS His Majesty King George the Fourth was graciously pleased Preamble. 'to issue His Letters Patent bearing date at Westminster the fifteenth ' day of December in the eighth year of His Reign, in the words following, viz:-

"Whereas the establishment of a College within our Province of New Bruns- Recital of the Charwick, in North America, for the education of Youth in the principles of the ter. Christian Religion, and for their instruction in the various branches of Science and Literature which are taught at our Universities in this Kingdom, would greatly conduce to the welfare of our said Province: And whereas humble application hath been made to us by many of our loving subjects in our said Province, that we would be pleased to grant our Royal Charter for the more perfect establishment of a College therein, and for incorporating the Members thereof for the purposes aforesaid: Now know ye, that we, having taken the premises into our Royal consideration, and duly weighing the great utility and importance of such an Institution, have of our special grace, certain knowledge and mere motion, ordained and granted, and do by these presents, for us, our heirs and successors, ordain and grant that there shall be established at or near our Town of Fredericton, in our said Province of New Brunswick, from this time, one College, with the style and privileges of an University as hereinafter directed, for the education and instruction of Youth and Students in Arts and Faculties, to continue for ever, to be called King's College; And we do hereby declare and grant that our trusty and well beloved the Right Reverend Father in God, John, Bishop of the Diocese
