A PROCLAMATION.

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME OR MAY CONCERN:

KNOW YE, that under and by virtue of the power and authority in me vested in and by an Act of Parliament made and passed in the fifth and sixth years of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act for regulating the Carriage of Passengers in Merchant Vessels," I do hereby declare by Proclamation, that the said Act, and every part thereof, except as therein excepted, shall apply and is hereby extended and applied to the carriage of Passengers by Sea from this Province of New Brunswick to any Port or Ports, place or places within the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS it appears from information which I have received from the Justices of the City and County of Saint John, that on or about the hour of Seven o'clock in the Evening of Saturday last, the 4th instant, a murderous assault, by Stabbing, was committed in the Streets of Portland, in the said County, by one

THOMAS BOWES, together with some other person or persons as yet unknown, upon James Goff, James Earle, and Henry Kinney, WATCHMEN, then being in the Execution of their duty; And whereas the said James Goff has since died from the effects of the wounds and violence inflicted on that occasion:—I do therefore publish this my Proclamation, and do hereby offer a Reward of TWO HUNDRED and FIFTY POUNDS, or One Thousand Dollars, to be paid to any person or persons (excepting the actual perpetrators of the fatal crime,) who shall apprehend the said THOMAS BOWES: And a Reward of ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, or Four Hundred Dollars, for such information to Her Majesty's Attorney General, as shall enable him to prosecute any of the offenders to conviction.

WHEREAS the Governor of Her Majesty's Province of New Brunswick, with the Council and Assembly of the said Province, did, in the months of March and April, 1847, pass three Acts, which have been transmitted, entitled as follows, viz:

No. 1749. An Act further to continue and amend an Act, intituled "An Act imposing Duties for raising a Revenue."

No. 1776. An Act to alter and amend the Act to regulate Sales by Public Auction.

No. 1777. An Act relating to Provincial Revenue.

And whereas the said Acts have been referred to the Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council, appointed for the consideration of all matters relating to Trade and Foreign Plantations, and the said Committee have reported as their opinion to Her Majesty, that the said Acts should be left to their operation; Her Majesty was thereupon this day pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve the said Report: Whereof the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Commander in Chief for the time being, of Her Majesty's Province of New Brunswick, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.
