A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS it appears, by an Inquest held before Cochrane
Craig and Wilford Fisher, Esquires, two of Her Majesty's
Justices of the Peace in and for the County of Charlotte, on view
of the body of Joseph Thomas, late of Grand Manan, in the said
County, found dead at or near the residence of Joseph Drugan, of
the same place, that the said Joseph Thomas came to his death on
the evening of the tenth day of August instant, by a blow from a
club on the left side of the head, inflicted by the hands of one John
Gilmore, late of Grand Manan aforesaid :

And whereas it appears that the said John Gilmore has escaped
from justice, and is now at large ; I do, therefore, publish this
Proclamation, and do hereby offer a Reward of Fifty Pounds to
any person or persons who shall apprehend the said John Gilmore,
and him safely lodge in any one of the Common Gaols of this Pro-
vince.

PROVINCIAL BOARD OF EDUCATION.

FREDERICTON, July 7, 1848.

IT is determined that fresh applications from Females for Parish
School Licences should be entertained ; and that a Certificate
of Moral Character from the Clergyman or Minister of the Com-
munion to which the Applicant belongs, nearest her residence,
together with a Certificate of Competency from two or more Mem-
bers of the late Board of Education for the County in which she
intends to commence Teaching, be the indispensable accompaniments
of the Petition to His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, but
not necessarily sufficient to ensure a Licence.

PROVINCIAL BOARD OF EDUCATION.

FREDERICTON, 13th July, 1848.

THE Provincial Board of Education have appointed Mr. E. H.
DUVAL, of the British School in Saint John, to be Teacher
of a Training School, in that City, under the ninth section of the
Parish School Act, with power to train, instruct and certify Teachers
and Candidates offering themselves for the Second and Third
Classes.

Those who purpose contending for Certificates of the First or
Highest Class, as possessing the knowledge required for such Class
under the Act, will necessarily have to repair to the principal School
in Fredericton ; all others must, in their applications for admission,
which are to be addressed to the Secretary of the Board, state
which School it will be most convenient for them to attend, and
their admission will be regulated accordingly.

The documents required to accompany the applications for ad-
mission are, in the case of Teachers :—

1. A Certificate of Moral Character from the Clergyman or
Minister of the Communion to which the Applicant belongs :
2. A Certificate, of the Trustees of Schools in the Parish where
last employed, of moral conduct and general satisfaction in School
Management.

In the case of Candidates, a Certificate of Moral Character must
be produced ; and the age of the Applicant, and intention of devo-
tion to the office of Parish School Teacher, must be stated in the
Petition. If the Applicant is a Minor, such intention must be cer-
tified by a parent or other guardian. The Candidate must be pre-
pared for and undergo a preliminary examination as to attainments,
before entering upon the course of training, in the Art of Teaching.
