Fredericton, August 1st, 1848.

At a Meeting of the City Council of the City of Fredericton, holden on the 11th day of August, A. D., 1848, the following Bye Laws were read and enacted:

A LAW

To regulate the Lines of the Streets and Highways within the City of Fredericton, and to prevent encroachments thereon.

E it enacted by the City Council of the City of Fredericton, That no person or persons shall hereafter erect any Building or Fence on any Street within that part of the City of Fredericton contained within the following limits, to-wit :- Beginning on the Southern Bank of the River Saint John at the upper Boundary of the said City, thence Southwesterly along the same until it strikes the prolongation of the rear line of the second range of Pasture Lots; thence along the said prolongation and rear line until it strikes the Road leading to the lower Boundary of the said City; thence East to the said River, and thence up along the Bank of the same to the place of beginning, unless the range of the said Building or Fence shall have been first laid down by the City Surveyor, under a penalty of not less than Five Shillings, and not exceeding Five Ponnds, for each and every offence; and if any Building or Fence hereafter to be erected, or any part thereof, within the limits aforesaid, shall project into the Street, beyond the range of such Street so laid down by the City Surveyor, the person or persons erecting the same, shall within three days after notice thereof is given to him or them by the City Surveyor, remove the said Building or Fence within the range so laid down as aforesaid, under the penalty of Five Pounds, and a further penalty of Ten Shillings for every twenty four hours that the said Building or Fence shall be continued beyond such range; which penalty or penalties shall be in addition to any other liability to which such person or persons may by law be subject.

II. And be it enacted, That the City Surveyor shall be entitled to the sum of Five Shillings for laying down the range of the Street, for each Town Lot on which any person shall place any Building, or put up any Fence adjoining such Street, to be paid by the Owner

of or Builder on said Lots.

III. And be it enacted, That this Law shall come into operation and be in force from the publication thereof, and continue for one year and no longer.

A LAW

To regulate Shops for the sale of Beer and other Beverages within the City of Fredericton.

I. B E it enacted by the City Council of the City of Fredericton, That the owner or occupier of every Shop or Building situate within the limits of the said City, wherein any Ginger or Spruce Beer, Cordials, or other beverages are or may be sold or vended, shall cause the doors of such Shop or Building to be kept closed on the Lord's Day, commonly called Sunday, and to be closed on every other day at ten of the clock in the evening; and no owner or occupier as aforesaid, shall sell or permit to be sold on his or her premises to any person or persons whomsoever, any such Ginger or Spruce Beer, Cordials, or other beverage as aforesaid, nor suffer any person or persons to remain in such Shop or Building on the Lord's Day, nor after the hour of ten of the clock as above mentioned, on any other day, under a penalty of not less than Five Shillings nor exceeding Five Pounds for each and every offence.

II. And be it enacted, That the owner or occupier of any Shop or Building wherein any such Beverages shall or may be sold or vended as aforesaid, shall, at all reasonable times, when called upon by such person or persons as may for that purpose be appointed, give free admission to such person or persons into said Shop or Building, and such owner or occupier shall to the ut-
