CAP. LXVII.

An Act for the better prevention of Illicit Trade.

Passed 30th March 1848.

BE it enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council and As- No Spirits (except sembly, That from and after the period at which this Act shall come the United Kinginto operation, no Spirits (except in bottle, and Spirits imported from the United Kingdom, or from Bond in any British Colonial Possession,) shall be imported into this Province in Casks or Packages of less size than to contain one hundred gallons, or in other than Decked Vessels of not less than thirty tons register; nor in other than and all Spirits imported into this Province contrary to the provisions of this Act, Decked Vessels not less than 30 or that may be found on board of any Vessel or Boat of less than thirty tons register, in Packages or Casks of less size than to contain one hundred gallons, within the limits of any Port or Ports of Entry in this Province, shall be seized, condemned and forfeited in like manner as other articles illegally imported.

II. And be it enacted, That all Goods, and all Ships, Vessels and Boats, and Authority given to

III. And be it enacted, That this Act shall not come into operation or be in Suspending clause. force until Her Majesty's assent thereto shall be first had and obtained.
