EASTER TERM, 11 Victoria, A. D. 1848.

GENERAL RULES.—(Clerk's Office.)

I. It is Ordered, That the following Regulations be observed in the Office of the Clerk of the Pleas:—

1st. No Judgment, Interlocutory or Final, to be signed in any cause until it is ascertained, upon search, that the cause has been duly entered; Provided, that where there is an Interlocutory Judgment, the search need not be repeated when final Judgment is signed; and provided also, that entries may be made as heretofore accustomed in case of Warrants of Attorney to confess Judgment.

2d. No Judgment to be signed on a Warrant of Attorney after one year from its date without the Order of the Court, or of a Judge.

3d. No Judgment to be signed upon any confession, cognovit, or retraxit, after one year from the date thereof, or from the Term whereof the same is granted, without the Order of the Court, or of a Judge.

4th. No Recognizance Roll of a Recognizance of Bail to be received or filed until it is ascertained, upon search, that the Recognizance or Bail-piece is on file.

5th. All Judgment Rolls to be endorsed with the title of the Term wherein Final Judgment is awarded; and when Judgment is entered in Vacation, then to be endorsed of the Term next preceding, and the Rolls are to be numbered consecutively as they are brought in and filed of such Term, and to be referred to in pleading as the Rolls of such Term.

II. It is further Ordered, That the General Rule of Michaelmas Term last, in regard to marking papers annexed to any Affidavit, shall not extend to Affidavits of Service of Writs returned by the Sheriff, or other Officer, to whom the Writs are respectively directed.
