

At a Meeting of the City Council of the City of Fredericton, holden on the 5th day of October, A. D. 1848, the following Bye Law was read and enacted:—

A LAW

To prevent Pedlars travelling and selling without Licence, and to regulate the sale of Patent Drugs and Medicines within the City of Fredericton.

I. **B**E it enacted by the City Council of the City of Fredericton, That no Hawker, Pedlar, Petty Chapman, or any other trading person or persons, going from Town to Town, or to other men's houses, and travelling either on foot or with a beast of burthen, or otherwise, carrying to sell or exposing to sale any goods, wares, merchandize, or chattels, shall be permitted to sell or expose for sale, within the limits of the said City, any goods, wares, merchandize, or chattels as aforesaid, without having first obtained a Licence for that purpose from the Mayor or Council of the said City, under a penalty of not less than Five Shillings, and not exceeding Five Pounds, for each and every offence.

II. And be it enacted, That every Pedlar, Hawker, Petty Chapman, or Itinerant Trader, as aforesaid, shall for each and every Licence, pay to the City Treasurer the following sums, to-wit:—

For every person travelling on foot, One Pound Five Shillings.

For every person travelling with a beast of burthen, bearing or drawing a burthen, the further sum of Two Pounds for each and every beast of burthen.

And for every waggon, cart, sled, or other carriage by land, or for any vessel, boat, or canoe, by water, and by a person or persons for the purpose aforesaid, the sum of Two Pounds.

III. And be it enacted, That every person so trading as aforesaid, who, upon demand made by the Mayor, any Councillor of the said City, Justice of the Peace, Sheriff, Constable, or any person with whom he or she shall be so trading as aforesaid, shall refuse to produce and show the Licence therefor, shall for each and every offence forfeit and pay the sum of Ten Shillings.

IV. And be it enacted, That any Hawker, Pedlar, Petty Chapman, or other Itinerant Trader as aforesaid, who shall be convicted of knowingly dealing, vending, or selling any kind of smuggled, contraband, or prohibited goods, wares or merchandize fraudulently or dishonestly procured, either by himself or through the medium of others, with his privity and knowledge, shall for ever thereafter be incapable of holding or obtaining any new Licence, or dealing, trafficking, or trading under the same, over and above all forfeitures, incapacities, fines and penalties, to which he is or shall be by Law subject, for such illicit and illegal trafficking and dealing.

V. And be it enacted, That nothing herein contained shall extend or be construed to extend to prohibit any person or persons from selling any Fruit, Fish, Victuals or Country produce, or to hinder any person or persons, who are the real makers or workers of any Goods or Wares or carrying about for sale or selling the Goods of his, her, or their own manufacture, from selling or vending such Goods and wares, nor shall any thing herein be contained to extend to Vessels of the burthen of fifteen tons.

VI. And be it enacted, That no Pedlar, Trader, Merchant, Apothecary or other person whosoever, shall, within the limits of the said City, sell, vend or expose for sale, or suffer to be sold, vended or exposed for sale on his or her premises, any Patent Drugs or Medicines, unless the Patentee or his Agent shall have first obtained a Licence therefor from the Mayor or Council as aforesaid, under a penalty of not less than Five Shillings, and not exceeding Five Pounds, for each and every offence.

VII. And be it enacted, That every person before

obtaining Licence so to sell, vend or expose for sale any Patent Drugs or Medicines as aforesaid, shall pay into the hands of the City Treasurer a sum not exceeding Five Pounds per annum, at the discretion of the Mayor or City Council, as the Fees on such Licence.

VIII. And be it enacted, That this Law shall come into operation on the first day of November next, and continue and be in force for one year and no longer.
