The meeting to take place at 12 o'clock, noon. The Office Bearers of the Society are requested to be on the ground at 11 o'clock, A. M., to select Judges, &c. The articles entered for prizes are to be classed and numbered. Samples of the Grain and of the Potatoes and Turnips, of not less than a bushel each, to be exhibited at the Show, and proof to be furnished at the Annual Meeting in January.

As the time has arrived when public attention must be turned to Agriculture as the principle resource of the Country, it is hoped that all classes will join in aiding and supporting the Agricultural Society, and that the Show will be generally attended.
