A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the General Assembly of this Province stands
prorogued to the last Tuesday of this present month of Sep-
tember, I have thought fit further to prorogue the said General
Assembly, and the same is hereby prorogued to the second Tuesday
in December next.

Given under my Hand and Seal, at Fredericton, the
eighteenth day of September, in the year of our Lord
one thousand eight hundred and forty eight, and in
the twelfth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

WHEREAS the Lieutenant Governor of Her Majesty's Pro-
vince of New Brunswick, with the Council and Assembly
of the said Province, did, in the months of March and April, 1848,
pass fifty four Acts, which have been transmitted, entitled as fol-
lows, viz:—

No. 1807. An Act to provide for the Collection and Protection
of the Revenue of this Province.

No. 1811. An Act for the better prevention of Illicit Trade.

No. 1815. An Act to provide for the necessities occasioned by
the failure of the Potato and other Crops during the past year.

No. 1816. An Act to appropriate a part of the Public Revenue
for the payment of the Ordinary Services of the Province.

No. 1817. An Act to appropriate a part of the Public Revenue
for the Services therein mentioned.

No. 1818. An Act to provide for opening and repairing Roads
and erecting Bridges throughout the Province.

No. 1823. An Act to increase the duty imposed on Shipping
entering the Bay or Harbour of Miramichi, for the support of
Buoys and Beacons.

No. 1824. An Act for establishing and maintaining a Police
Force in the Parish of Portland, in the City and County of Saint
John.

No. 1825. An Act more effectually to provide for the support of
a Nightly Watch and Day Police in that part of the City of Saint
John lying on the eastern side of the Harbour of Saint John, and
for lighting the same, as also for other purposes.

No. 1826. An Act in further amendment of the Law.

No. 1827. An Act in addition to the Law relating to Juries.

No. 1828. An Act to provide for the better payment of Petit
Jurors attending the several Courts of Record in this Province.

No. 1829. An Act to amend the Law relating to the Registry
of Deeds and other Instruments.

No. 1830. An Act to continue an Act relating to Circuit Courts
in this Province, and to provide for the travelling expenses of the
Judges holding such Courts.

No. 1831. An Act to alter and amend an Act relating to the
Great Roads of Communication through this Province.

No. 1832. An Act for the regulating of the Navigation of Small
Rivers and Streams, and the building of Dams across the same, in
this Province.

No. 1834. An Act to authorize the Justices of the Peace in the
several Counties of this Province to make regulations for the Mar-
kets.

No. 1835. An Act to regulate the measurement of Fire Wood
and Bark.

No. 1836. An Act to grant a Bounty on the destruction of Bears
and Wolves in this Province.

No. 1837. An Act to prevent the growth and increase of Thistles.

No. 1838. An Act to explain an Act, intituled "An Act to
enable the Justices of the Peace of the several Counties in this
Province for the time being, to receive for public uses Grants of
Land lying in their respective Counties, and to regulate the Com-
mons belonging to the several Townships or Parishes within the
same."

No. 1839. An Act for ascertaining the Population of this Pro-
vince, and for other purposes therein mentioned.

No. 1840. An Act in addition to the Acts relating to the Pro-
vincial Penitentiary.

No. 1841. An Act to amend an Act for the amendment of the
Charter of the City of Saint John.

No. 1842. An Act to amend an Act to provide for increasing
the number of Special Constables in the City of Saint John, and for
appointing Special Constables in the City and County of Saint
John.

No. 1842a. An Act further to continue an Act, intituled "An
Act to extend the jurisdiction of the Corporation of the City of
Saint John, for the regulation of the rates of Pilotage beyond the
limits now prescribed by the Charter."

No. 1843. An Act relating to the Public Burial Ground in the
City of Saint John.

No. 1844. An Act to authorize the Justices of the Peace for the
City and County of Saint John to raise a sum of money for making
certain alterations in and additions to the Common Gaol of the
said City and County.

No. 1845. An Act to authorize the Justices of the Peace for the
City and County of Saint John to levy an assessment for the pay-
ment of expenses incurred in the preservation of the Public Peace
in the Parish of Portland, and in lighting a part of the said Parish
with Gas.

No. 1846. An Act to continue an Act to prevent the spread of
a disorder now existing in certain parts of the Counties of Glouces-
ter and Northumberland.

No. 1847. An Act to provide for a Town Clock in Fredericton.

No. 1848. An Act to authorize Her Majesty's Justices of the
Peace for the County of Charlotte to assess the inhabitants of said
County to pay off the County Debt, and to provide for the contin-
gent expenses thereof.

No. 1849. An Act to enable the Justices of the Peace for the
County of Carleton to pay certain expenses incurred in preserving
the Peace in said County.
