## POST OFFICE NOTICE.

**A**NY Persons desirous of entering into a Contract for carrying by Express, from Halifax to Saint John, via Amherst or Annapolis, the Mails from England for New Brunswick, which leave Liverpool every Saturday during April, May, June, July, August, September, October and November, and every alternate Saturday during the remainder of the year, will send in Sealed Tenders addressed to the Deputy Post Master General at Saint John, until noon on Saturday the 16th instant.

Tenders will be received at the same time for the conveyance of the New Brunswick Mails from Saint John to Halifax, to meet the sailing of the Packets from Halifax, which leave Boston and New York every Wednesday during the above named eight months of the year, and every alternate Wednesday during the other four months.

The particulars of the Contract are, that the Mails must be conveyed at a rate of speed of not less than eight miles an hour, and Letters and Newspapers together. The Tenders to express the rate per mile in Currency for which the service will be performed, and the names of two persons willing to become bound with the party tendering, for the faithful performance of the same, must accompany each Tender. One only of the routes will be adopted.

The Contractor will not be allowed to carry any passengers with those Mails.
