WHEREAS the Lieutenant Governor of Her Majesty's Pro-

of the said Province, did, in the month of March, 1849, pass an
Act, which has been transmitted, entitled as follows, viz:—

No. 1909. An Act relating to Buoys and Beacons in the Har-
bour of Buctouche, in the County of Kent.

And whereas the said Act has been referred to the Committee
of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council,
appointed for the consideration of all matters relating to Trade and
Foreign Plantations; and the said Committee have reported as
their opinion to Her Majesty, that the said Act should be left to
its operation; Her Majesty was thereupon this day pleased, by
and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve the said Re-
port: Whereof the Governor, Lieutenant Governor or Commander
in Chief for the time being of Her Majesty's Province of New
Brunswick, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take
notice and govern themselves accordingly,
