These Accounts are properly vouched, and are satisfactory; they shew that 54 Paupers have been in the Alms House during the past year; of this number, 9 have died, and 24 still remain in the establishment. Relief has also been afforded to 39 weekly out-door Paupers, and 25 continue to receive assistance.

In addition to the in and out-door Paupers, about two hundred payments have been made to sundry transient persons, for temporary relief; there have been 19 deaths among the weekly and transient Paupers.

And to meet which, there is £257 16 5 deposited by the Treasurer in the Central Bank, and £260 yet to be accounted for by the Collectors on account of assessment ordered by the General Sessions in 1848.

The Treasurer informed the Committee that £185 2 4 of the assessment of 1848, had been paid in by the Col-

lectors since his Accounts were made up to the end of the year, and that £378 1 11 is still due.

The Treasurer's Accounts appear to have been kept with great care, and are properly vouched.

From the balances of unpaid Accounts in the hands of the Treasurer, together with those referred by the Committee to the Court, shew that the County Debt to the 31st December, 1848, including the Gaol, and giving credit for the whole assessment of 1848, amounts to £802 3 11.

The Committee have to regret the increased Debt of the County after the large assessment in 1848, (£960,) however, this can only be attributed to the heavy expense incurred on account of the riots in Fredericton in 1847, and the loss of revenue to the County for Tavern, Retail and Auctioneer Licences, collected by Corporation of the City of Fredericton since June last.

Your Committee beg leave to recommend that this Report be forthwith published for the information of the Public. All which is respectfully submitted by
