REPORT.

That they have attended to that duty, and that the amount agreed upon to be borne by the City of Frederickton, is two hundred and sixty pounds, and which will be in full for Gaol and County Debt, up to the 31st day of December, 1848, last; and they further Report—The proportion to be borne by the City of Frederickton, of expenses attendant upon the administration of justice hereafter in the said County, shall be one fourth.
