A PROCLAMATION.

THEREAS the General Assembly of this Province stands prorogued to the second Tuesday in September next, I have thought fit further to prorogue the said General Assembly, and the same is hereby further prorogued to the fourth Tuesday in November next.

Given under my Hand and Seal, at Fredericton, the twenty ninth day of August, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty nine, and in the thirteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

MINING REGULATIONS.

1st.
