

house or building had taken fire before the order made or executed for the destruction thereof.

XXIV. And be it enacted, That every citizen shall repair on alarm of fire to the scene of the same, and that all persons present thereat shall yield prompt obedience to the directions of the Firewards, or any of them; either by forming water lines or doing any other reasonable act ordered by the said Firewards, or either of them, and that at and during the continuance of any fire any person or persons refusing or omitting to obey such order of any Firewards, or who shall be guilty of riotous or disorderly conduct at such fire, or shall obstruct or endeavour to obstruct the carrying out of the orders of any Fireward, shall and may be committed to the Gaol of the City by any Constable under the order of any Fireward; provided always, that in case of such committal it shall be the duty of such Fireward immediately after such fire, or as soon as may be, and at farthest within twenty four hours after, to cause the person so committed to be brought before the Mayor, or two of the members of the City Council, to answer for his offence, and to receive such further punishment (if any) as may be directed under this Law, or any other Law then in force.

XXV. And be it enacted, That all the duties prescribed in this Act, (except as regards those of the Committee of Superintendence and the Firewards,) and not herein otherwise specially provided for, shall be discharged by the respective parties charged with such duties, under penalty of fine or imprisonment, or both, as is herein in this section described; and all offences against the provisions of this Act shall be punished by fine or imprisonment, or both, as may seem meet in the case, and sued for and prosecuted; and all penalties and punishments shall be imposed and awarded in the manner prescribed by any Law of the Corporation now or hereafter to be in force for the recovery of fines, penalties and forfeitures; provided always, that no fine to be levied for failure in discharge of duty or offence against this Law shall exceed the sum of three pounds, and that no imprisonment awarded shall extend beyond the term of twenty days, and that all fines imposed and recovered hereunder shall be paid to the City Treasurer, and held by him to the credit of the general funds of the City.

XXVI. And be it enacted, That this Law shall come into operation and be in force from the publication thereof, and shall be held and taken to be in lieu of all Laws now in force relating to fires within the said City.
