CAP. XXXIX.

An Act to consolidate and amend various Acts of Assembly relating to the further amendment of the Law.

Passed 14th April 1849.

THEREAS it is expedient that several Acts of Asembly relating to the Preamble. amendment of the Law should be amended and consolidated into one

I. Be it therefore enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council Repeal of the foland Assembly, That the several Acts and parts of Acts hereinafter mentioned be parts of Statutes and and the same are hereby repealed, (save as hereinafter otherwise is provided,) that is to say: An Act made and passed in the twenty sixth year of the Reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled An Act to prevent unnecessary 26 G. 3, c. 21, expense in actions on the case on judgment by default; also an Act made and passed in the twenty sixth year of the same Reign, intituled An Act to prevent frivolous 26 G. 3, c. 25, and vexatious arrests; also an Act made and passed in the fourth year of the Reign of King George the Fourth, intituled An Act to provide for the surrender 4 G. 4, c. 17, of the principal in discharge of Bail in actions pending in the Supreme Court of Judicature of this Province; also an Act made and passed in the eighth year of the same Reign, intituled An Act for the more easy assessment of damages in actions 8 G. 4, c. 4, on Bonds payable by instalments and other similar instruments, and for the more con-
