**W**HEREAS it has pleased Almighty God, of His great mercy,  
to bless the labour of the Husbandman with an abundant  
Harvest: And whereas it is meet and proper, and our bounden

I have therefore thought fit, by the advice of Her Majesty's Ex-  
ecutive Council, hereby to appoint a General Thanksgiving to  
Almighty God, to be observed throughout this Province on Thurs-  
day the eleventh day of October next; And I do hereby strictly  
charge and command that the said Day of Thanksgiving be reli-  
giously and devoutly observed by all Her Majesty's loving Subjects  
within this Province.

#### A PROCLAMATION.

**W**HEREAS one Hugh Murchie, late Master of the Barque  
"Ianthe," of the Port of Saint Stephen, in this Province,  
by the evidence of Patrick Fitzpatrick and another, taken in July  
last, before the Honorable Thomas C. Ayiwin, one of the Justices  
of Her Majesty's Court of Queen's Bench, for the District of Que-  
bec, in Canada, is charged with having been guilty of the wilful

murder of William Welch, a passenger on board of the said Barque,  
while on her passage from Waterford, in Ireland, to Quebec: And  
whereas the said Hugh Murchie has absconded and disappeared,  
and is supposed to have fled to this Province, of which he is said  
to be a native, I do publish this Proclamation, and hereby call upon  
all Her Majesty's Peace Officers and liege subjects to make in-  
quiry and search after the said Hugh Murchie, and if found within  
the Province, him to carry before some one of Her Majesty's Jus-  
tices of the Peace within the County where he may be taken, to be  
thereafter dealt with according to Law.

Said to be a native of New Brunswick; is about five feet eight  
inches in height, about thirty eight or forty years of age, broad  
across the chest and shoulders, complexion very swarthy, brown  
eyes, the white of the eye tinged with yellow, face round, nose short  
and a little crooked at the point, large black whiskers meeting  
round the chin and neck, neck short and thick, hair long, thin and  
black, heavy black eyebrows, heavy walk, large mouth, well formed,  
stout figure, two wrinkles leading from each eye, lips rather thick,  
wears a black frock coat, black satin vest, black cravat, light blue  
trousers with black stripe, shirt collar turned down.
