## AT THE COURT AT BALMORAL,

PRESENT:

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty, His Royal Highness Prince ALBERT,

Lord John Russell, Mr. Maule, Sir Francis Baring, Bt.

HEREAS the Lieutenant Governor of Her Majesty's Province of New Brunswick, with the Council and Assembly of the said Province, did, in the month of March, 1850, pass an Act, which has been transmitted, entitled as follows, viz:—

No. 1954. An Act to regulate Vessels arriving from Europe

with Passengers.

And whereas the said Act has been referred to the Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council appointed for the consideration of all matters relating to Trade and Foreign Plantations, and the said Committee have reported as their opinion to Her Majesty, that the said Act should be left to its operation; Her Majesty was thereupon this day pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve the said Report: Whereof the Governor, Lieutenat Governor, or Commander in Chief for the time being, of Her Majesty's Province of New Brunswick, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.
