prorogued to Thursday the twenty sixth day of September
next, I have thought fit further to prorogue the said General
Assembly, and the same is hereby further prorogued to Thursday
the twelfth day of December next.

thirty first day of August, in the year of our Lord one
thousand eight hundred and fifty, and in the four-
teenth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

WHEREAS the Lieutenant Governor of Her Majesty's Pro-
vince of New Brunswick, with the Council and Assembly
of the said Province, did, in the month of March, 1850, pass an Act,
which has been transmitted, entitled as follows, viz:—

No. 1954. An Act to regulate Vessels arriving from Europe
with Passengers.

And whereas the said Act has been referred to the Committee of
the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council ap-
pointed for the consideration of all matters relating to Trade and
Foreign Plantations, and the said Committee have reported as their
opinion to Her Majesty, that the said Act should be left to its
operation; Her Majesty was thereupon this day pleased, by and
with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve the said Report:
Whereof the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Commander in
Chief for the time being, of Her Majesty's Province of New Brun-
swick, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice
and govern themselves accordingly.

REGULATIONS:—

Government may resume and take the improvements at a valuation
to be made by Arbitrators mutually chosen by the Surveyor General
for the time being and by the Lessee or his Assigns.
