make Proclamation to all whom it may concern, that I have,  
by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council,  
opened and declared the following Ports to be Free Ports, viz:—

Dorchester,	Dalhousie,
Richibucto,	Bathurst,
Campo Bello,	Carraquet,
Saint Stephen,	Shediac,
Saint George—Magaguadavic,	Fredericton;

and the same are hereby constituted and appointed Free Ports for  
the admission of Foreign as well as British and Colonial Shipping  
and Goods, under the Act or Acts of Parliament in such case made  
or to be made and provided, and subject to the Regulations estab-  
lished by the Imperial Customs in t at behalf.

Given under my Hand and Seal, at Fredericton, the  
twenty ninth day of April, in the year of our Lord  
one thousand eight hundred and fifty, and in the  
thirteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign.
