A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by an Act made and passed during the present Session of the Legislature of this Province, I have been authorized, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, whenever it may be thought advisable so to do, to declare by Proclamation what articles, the growth, produce or manufacture of either of the British North American Possessions of Canada, Nova Scotia, Prince Edward Island and Newfoundland, may be imported into this Province free of Duty;

I have, therefore, thought fit, by and with the advice and consent aforesaid, to declare, and I do hereby declare, that the following articles, being of the growth, production or manufacture of the said British North American Possessions of Canada, Nova Scotia and Prince Edward Island, or of either of them, may be imported into this Province free of Duty, that is to say:—

Grain and Bread Stuffs of all kinds, Vegetables, Fruits, Seeds, Hay and Straw, Animals, Salted and Fresh Meats, Butter, Cheese, Lard, Tallow, Hides, Horns, Wool, Undressed Skins and Furs of all kinds, Ores of all kinds, Iron in Pigs and Blooms, Copper, Lead in Pigs, Grindstones and Stones of all kinds, Earth, Coals, Lime, Ochres, Gypsum ground and unground, Rock Salt, Wood, Timber and Lumber of all kinds, Firewood, Ashes, Fish, Fish Oil, viz:—Train Oil, Spermaceti Oil, Head Matter and Blubber, Fins and Skins, the produce of Fish or creatures living in the Sea.
