A PROCLAMATION.

THEREAS the General Assembly of this Province stands prorogued to Thursday the twenty sixth day of September next, I have thought fit further to prorogue the said General Assembly, and the same is hereby further prorogued to Thursday the twelfth day of December next.

Ist.
