Downing Street, 9th July, 1850.

SIR,—It is with the greatest regret that I have to communicate to you the melancholy intelligence of the death of His Royal Highness the Duke of Cambridge.

His Royal Highness expired at Cambridge House on the evening of the eighth instant, at twenty minutes before ten o'clock, to the great affliction of the Royal Family, and of all classes of Her Majesty's subjects.
