A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the General Assembly of this Province stands
prorogued to the fourth Thursday in this present month
of December, I have thought fit to prorogue the said General
Assembly, and the same is hereby prorogued to Thursday the
seventh day of February next, then to meet at Fredericton for the
dispatch of business.

Given under my Hand and Seal, at Fredericton, the
nineteenth day of December, in the year of our Lord
one thousand eight hundred and forty nine, and in the
thirteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

WHEREAS the Lieutenant Governor of Her Majesty's Pro-
vince of New Brunswick, with the Council and Assembly
of the said Province, did, in the month of April, 1849, pass an Act,
which has been transmitted, entitled as follows, viz :—

No. 1874. An Act for the reduction of Judicial Salaries in this
Province.

And whereas the said Act has been referred to the Committee
of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council
appointed for the consideration of all matters relating to Trade and
Foreign Plantations, and the said Committee have reported as their
opinion to Her Majesty, that the said Act should receive Her
Majesty's special confirmation; Her Majesty was thereupon this
day pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to de-
clare Her special confirmation of the said Act, and the same is
hereby specially confirmed, ratified and finally enacted accordingly :
Whereof the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Commander in
Chief for the time being of Her Majesty's Province of New Brun-
swick, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice
and govern themselves accordingly.

for allowances to Teachers of Common or Parish Schools, unless
it shall be certified by at least two Trustees of Schools for the Parish
where such School has been taught, shewing the time actually
taught—the Teacher to be licenced—the cause why such Teacher
was not certified to the Sessions in the ordinary way—and that
such Teacher was not compelled to discontinue his or her School
on account of any improper conduct.
