THEREAS the General Assembly of this Province stands prorogued to the fourth Thursday in this present month of December, I have thought fit to prorogue the said General Assembly, and the same is hereby prorogued to Thursday the seventh day of February next, then to meet at Fredericton for the dispatch of business.

No. 1874. An Act for the reduction of Judicial Salaries in this Province.

And whereas the said Act has been referred to the Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council appointed for the consideration of all matters relating to Trade and Foreign Plantations, and the said Committee have reported as their opinion to Her Majesty, that the said Act should receive Her Majesty's special confirmation; Her Majesty was thereupon this day pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to de-Chief for the time being of Her Majesty's Province of New Bruns- 100 acres, lot 66, Colebrook, P.
