EXHIBITION OF INDUSTRY OF ALL NATIONS TO BE HOLDEN IN
LONDON IN 1851.

Downing Street, 24th Oct., 1850.

SIR,—I have the honor to inform you that the Royal Commis-
sioners for the Exhibition of 1851, have apprized me that they are
prepared to allot to each of Her Majesty's Colonies a net available
amount of wall or hanging space, equal to one half of the gross
amount of area space communicated to you in my Circular Despatch
of the 18th of April last, and I have to request that you will cause
this announcement to be made known to the Authorities in the
Colony under your Government, in order that it may receive the
desired publicity.

REGULATIONS:—

1st. That the right of mining within a Tract of one square mile,

Mineral to the value of one hundred pounds from his ground, within
any one year after the first, during the continuance of his Lease,
the same shall become forfeited.

5th. That the Lease contain a clause of renewal, or that the
Government may resume and take the improvements at a valuation
to be made by Arbitrators mutually chosen by the Surveyor General
for the time being and by the Lessee or his Assigns.
