REGULATIONS:—

1st. That the right of Mining within a Tract of one square mile, for the term of twenty five years, be put up at a fixed Rent of one shilling per Chaldron on Coal, and five per cent. on the value of all other Minerals raised, to be paid quarterly, on the first days of January, April, July and October, in each year, to the Receiver

General, or an Agent for that purpose to be appointed by the Government.

2nd. That the upset preference price paid on each Lot be five pounds.

3rd. That the preference money be paid and the ground selected within one hour after the time of sale, after which other Lots will be offered, if required, in like manner.
