CROWN LAND OFFICE, April 15, 1850.

THE following copy of a Minute, passed by His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, in Council, on the thirteenth instant, is published for the information and guidance of all concerned, and they are hereby required to take due notice thereof, and govern themselves accordingly:—

"In reference to Mr. Perley's Report on the Fisheries, it is Ordered, that no further sales be made of any parts of the Sea Beaches, in the Gulf of Saint Lawrence, and Bay Chaleur, which are hereafter specified, but that the same be reserved, and suitable portions leased for the purposes of the Fishery, as applications therefor from time to time may be made.

"The Rents and Terms to be determined so soon as a Report is made of their respective values and extent.

"No more ground to be attached to any one Berth than is absolutely necessary to its proper enjoyment, in order as much as possible to prevent monopoly. The Leases to be granted for five years only, and to terminate whenever the Berths cease to be occupied. A renewal to be optional with the Government, but if the Berth continues to be occupied, without objection on the part of the Lessee, or renewal by the Government, the Rent to be doubled.

"Unless the several parties at present in illegal possession forthwith take out Leases, in conformity with these conditions, they will immediately be proceeded against as intruders.

"That the Licences of occupation granted to Duncan Hay of a part of Miscou, and of Carquet Island to Joseph Read, be cancelled, as also the permission, claimed by sundry parties near Niguac, to cut the wild grass on Portage Island.

"That the privilege of cutting the grass growing on all these Reserves be offered for sale annually by Mr. Davidson, on the spot, after due notice, in such small subdivisions, and at such upset prices, as may be deemed most advisable for the accommodation of the poorer Settlers in the neighbourhood. The proceeds to be remitted to the Receiver General, and carried to credit of the Fishery Fund.
