WHEREAS the Lieutenant Governor of Her Majesty's Province of New Brunswick, with the Council and Assembly of the said Province, did, in the month of April 1850, and March 1851, pass seven Acts, which have been transmitted, entitled as follows, viz :--

No. 1967. An Act to amend the Act providing for the collection and protection of the Revenue of this Province.

No. 1968. An Act to consolidate the Laws relating to Buoys and Beacons.

No. 1982. An Act relating to the Trade between this Province and the United States of America.

No. 1983. An Act to establish the amount of certain Silver Coins that shall be taken in payment as a legal tender in this Province.

No. 2005. An Act to consolidate and amend the Laws relating to Sick and Disabled Seamen belong to this Province, not being Paupers.

No. 2014. An Act to establish a Board of Health in the City and County of Saint John.

No. 2061. An Act to incorporate the European and North American Railway Company.

And whereas the said Acts have been referred to the Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council appointed for the consideration of all matters relating to Trade and Foreign Plantations, and the said Committee have reported as their opinion to Her Majesty, that the said Acts should be left to their operation; Her Majesty was thereupon this day pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve the said Report: Whereof the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Commander in Chief for the time being, of Her Majesty's Province of New Brunswick, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.
