Tenders will be received until SATURDAY the 18th instant, at noon, each Tender to give the names of two responsible persons to become bound with the party tendering for the due and faithful performance of the service.

It is to be distinctly understood that persons tendering for the above service, will have no claim whatever upon the Legislature for any, the smallest remuneration, over and above the amount named in the Tender.
