These Accounts are properly vouched, and are satisfactory; they shew that 48 Paupers have been in the Alms House during the past year, and of this number, 5 have died, and 36 still remain in the Establishment.

Relief has also been afforded to 33 weekly out-door Paupers, and 10 continue to receive assistance. In addition to the in and out-door Paupers, about 110 payments for temporary relief; there have been 5 deaths among the weekly and transient Paupers.

The Committee regret to remark, that the Collectors in the different Parishes have been very relax in their duty during the past year, particularly in the City of Fredericton, as only £100 was paid into the hands of the Treasurer of the Alms House on account of Assessment for 1849, when his Accounts were made up.

The Treasurer informed the Committee, that the liabilities of the Alms House Establishment to the 30th of November last, amounted to £687 8 4½; however, this large amount is in some measure owing to the expense incurred on account of the Small Pox, which through the exertions of the Commissioners, and proper treatment of Doctor Hartt, was soon subdued.

The Committee requested the Treasurer to furnish a separate and detailed Account of this expenditure, which amounts to £198 3 11, and is herewith attached which shows 43 cases, and of this number, 7 died.

In this Account, the Committee observe a charge of £40 made by Doctor Hartt for extra professional services, which the Committee think high, considering that by his Contract he was bound to attend all in and out-door Patients, still the Committee, from information obtained from the Commissioners, recommend to the Court that he receive £20 for his services.

The Treasurer informs the Committee that £177 6 8 has been received from the Collectors of the several Parishes since his Accounts were made up.
