And to meet which, there is £165 4 1 deposited in the Central Bank, and £159 3 7 still to be collected on the assessment for 1848, making £324 7 8.

The Committee regret to find by the Statement of Balances of unpaid Accounts furnished by the Treasurer, that £993 9 2 is still due to individuals.

From the Balances of unpaid Accounts in the hands of the Treasurer, together with those furnished by the Auditor for the consideration of the Court, amounting to £154 7 8, the County Debt to the 30th November last amounted to £1,147 17s., exclusive of the balance due on the New Gaol.

The Committee feel it their duty to bring under the consideration of the Court the unwarrantable neglect of the Collectors through the County during the last two years, as will appear by the following Assessments, ordered by the Sessions in 1848 and 1849, there being £235 10 4½ on the former, and £119 on the latter unaccounted for when the Accounts were made up to the 30th of November last, since which, the Treasurer states, he has received £86 1 8½.

The Treasurer's Accounts appear to have been kept with care, and are properly vouched.

The Auditor, whose Reports the Committee beg leave to lay before the Court, has satisfactorily performed the

duties devolved on him, and the Committee therefore recommend that he be allowed the sum of £10 for his services for the past year.

From documents laid before the Committee by the Treasurer and Auditor, the Committee make the County Debt to the 30th of November, 1849, as follows:—
