CAP. XXXVI.

An Act to facilitate the construction of a Railway from Saint Andrews to Quebec.

Passed 28th March 1851.

BE it enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council and Assembly,

1. When the Shareholders of the Saint Andrews and Quebec Rail Road Company shall pay into their Treasurer at least the sum of two thousand pounds sterling, and it shall be satisfactorily proved to the Lieutenant Governor in Council that such sum has been actually paid in, and is ready to be expended in the construction within this Province of a Railway from Saint Andrews to Woodstock, the Provincial Treasurer shall be authorized by the Lieutenant Governor in Council to subscribe on behalf of the Province for shares in the said Company to the like amount, and in payment therefor to deliver to the said Company special Certificates of Debt, to be called Debentures, bearing interest at a rate not exceeding six per cent. per annum, the principal money redeemable in thirty years; and so from time to time when it shall be satisfactorily proved to the Lieutenant Governor in Council that the sums theretofore subscribed and paid in by the shareholders of the said Company, and the proceeds of the Debentures previously delivered, have been expended in the construction of the said Railway, and that

When the Shareholders pay to their Treasurer £2,000 sterling, stock to a like amount to be taken by the Province, and Debentures delivered to the Company for the amount.

On further payments of £2,000 by the shareholders, the like additional amounts of stock to be taken.
