A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS in and by an Act of the General Assembly of this Province made and passed in the thirteenth year of the Reign of Her Present Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act for the establishment and regulation of Inland Posts within this Province," it is among other things enacted, that the said Act should come into operation and be in force at such time as might be fixed therefor by Proclamation of the Lieutenant Governor or Administrator of the Government for the time being of this Province:

Now Know Ye, that in pursuance of the provisions of the said recited Act, I do hereby proclaim and direct that the said Act shall come into operation and be in force on the seventh day of July now next ensuing: Whereof all persons whom it may concern are hereby required to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.
