DEATH OF LADY COLEBROOKE.—Barbadoes papers announce the death of Lady Colebrooke, consort of His Excellency Sir William Colebrooke, late Lieutenant Governor of New Brunswick, and at present Governor of the Windward and Leeward Islands. Her Layship died on the 19th of April. The annexed extract we copy from the *Barbadoes Liberal* :—

She was well on Saturday evening, when she left Government House for Dunscombe, in the Parish of Saint Thomas's; so well that she got out of her carriage and walked up the steep hill to the house; on arriving at which, she complained of a severe pain in her chest, called for a glass of water—sat down, and almost immediately breathed her last!—and thus passed away from us an ornament to society—a pattern to her sex as a wife and mother, and a most liberal and kind benefactress to the indigent and the poor.
