WHEREAS the Lieutenant Governor of Her Majesty's
Province of New Brunswick, with the Council and Assembly
of the said Province, did, in the months of March and April, 1851,
pass sixty five Acts which have been transmitted, entitled as follows,
viz :—

No. 2072. An Act to make further provision for the service of
Non-Bailable Process.

No. 2073. An Act relating to the competency of Witnesses in
certain cases.

No. 2074. An Act to continue an Act to authorize the com-
mutation of Debts due the Crown by settlers in certain cases for
work on the Public Roads.

No. 2075. An Act imposing Duties for raising a Revenue.

No. 2076. An Act to establish places for Polling in the Parish
of Wickham, in Queen's County.

No. 2077. An Act to repeal the third Section of an Act to
grant a Bounty on the destruction of Bears and Wolves in this
Province, and to make other provisions in lieu thereof.

No. 2078. An Act to alter and amend an Act, intituled "An
Act to incorporate the New Brunswick Society for the encourage-
ment of Agriculture, Home Manufactures and Commerce through-
out the Province, and to regulate and provide for the same."

No. 2079. An Act to alter and amend the Act, intituled "An
Act imposing Duties for raising a Revenue."

No. 2080. An Act imposing a Duty on Hacmatack or Juniper
Knees, Roots and Foothooks, exported from this Province.

No. 2082. An Act to appropriate part of the Public Revenue
for the payment of the Ordinary Services of the Province.

No. 2083. An Act to appropriate a part of the Public Revenue
for the services therein mentioned.

No. 2084. An Act to provide for opening and repairing Roads
and erecting Bridges throughout the Province.

No. 2085. An Act to revive and continue certain Acts of Assem-
bly providing for expenses of the Legislature.

No. 2086. An Act to consolidate and amend the Laws providing
for the maintenance of Light Houses in the Bay of Fundy.

No. 2087. An Act to authorize the issue of Treasury Debentures
to raise money for the purpose of being loaned for rebuilding a part
of the City of Fredericton destroyed by fire in the month of
November one thousand eight hundred and fifty.

No. 2088. An Act for shortening the language used in Acts of
Assembly in this Province.

No. 2089. An Act to amend the Law relative to the adminis-
tration of Criminal Justice.

No. 2090. An Act in further amendment of the Law.

No. 2091. An Act relative to recognizances for the appearance
of persons on criminal charges.

No. 2092. An Act relating to the registry of Decrees of Parti-
tion made in the Court of Chancery.

No. 2093. An Act to authorize the confirmation of Certificates
of Bankruptcy in certain cases.

No. 2094. An Act to secure to married Women real and per-
sonal property held in their own right.

No. 2095. An Act relating to Grand Juries in this Province.

No. 2096. An Act to revive and continue an Act to provide for
the better payment of Petit Jurors attending the several Courts of
Record in the Province.

No. 2097. An Act to provide for the transportation of News-
papers and Tracts throughout this Province without any imposition
of Postage.

No. 2098. An Act to revive and continue an Act to alter and
amend the Act to regulate Sales by Public Auction.

No. 2099. An Act to revive and continue an Act to provide for
the more effectual prevention of Tresspasses and protection of
Timber growing on the Crown Lands within this Province.

No. 2100. An Act to amend an Act to consolidate and amend
the Laws relating to the local government of Counties, Towns
and Parishes.

No. 2101. An Act for the protection and regulation of the Sea
and River Fisheries of this Province.

No. 2102. An Act to establish the Road leading from the
Baptist Meeting House, in the Parish of Upham, in King's County,
to the Church in Sussex Vale, as one of the Great Roads of
communication.

No. 2103. An Act to establish the Road leading from the Great
Road running from Fredericton to the Finger Board, at or near
James Tilley's, in the Parish of Sheffield, County of Sunbury, to
the Great Road running from Fredericton to the Bend of Petit-
codiac, as one of the Great Roads of communication.

No. 2104. An Act to establish the Road from Lower Trout
Brook Bridge, on the Great Road between Saint Andrews and
Fredericton, to the Town of Magaguadavic, as one of the Great
Roads of communication.

No. 2106. An Act for erecting the Parish of Caraquet, in the
County of Gloucester, into two separate Parishes.

No. 2107. An Act to authorize Her Majesty's Justices of the
Peace for the County of Gloucester to assess the said County to
pay off the County Debts.

No. 2108. An Act to continue an Act to empower the owners
of certain Saw Mills on Hammond River, in King's County, to
