WHEREAS the number of applications to this House from
School Teachers for Grants of Money have been from year

for allowances to Teachers of Common or Parish Schools, unless it
shall be certified by at least two Trustees of Schools for the Parish
where such School has been taught, shewing the time actually
taught—the Teacher to be licenced—the cause why such Teacher
was not certified to the Sessions in the ordinary way—and that
such Teacher was not compelled to discontinue his or her School
on account of any improper conduct.
