GOVERNMENT NOTICE.

MHE following Regulations for the outside Fisheries in Nor-L thumberland, have been duly approved by His Honor the Administrator of the Government in Council, viz:-

lst. That between Grand Downs and Hay Island, including Burnt Church, and also in front of Lots 78 to 81, both inclusive, in the Parish of Alnwick, in the County of Northumberland, from the Nets in that district being set on killocks, and from the Warden for Northumberland having represented the impossibility of taking the Nets up on Sunday, unless at a ruinous expense to the Fishermen, the Warden be not required to enforce the Law for taking up the Nets on Sunday in that district; but notwithstanding, all persons are hereby prohibited from taking Fish or fishing their Nets in the above district between eleven o'clock on Saturday night and one o'clock on Monday morning, under a penalty of five pounds for each and every breach of this Order.

2nd. That from and after the publication of this Order, the length of Salmon Nets set between Escuminac and the west end of Huckleberry Island, shall not respectively exceed in length two hundred fathoms, under the penalty of fifteen pounds for each and every breach of this Order; and from the westerly end of Huckleberry Island to within one mile and a half of the northerly end of Fox Island, the length of Salmon Nets respectively shall not exceed two hundred and fifty fathoms, under the like penalty for each and every breach of this Order; and from the southerly end of Passage or
