prorogued to Tuesday the twenty third day of December
instant, I have thought fit to prorogue the said General Assembly,
and the same is hereby prorogued to Wednesday the seventh day
of January next, then to meet at Fredericton for the dispatch of
business.

To all to whom these presents shall come or may concern, Greeting:

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS it has been represented to His Excellency the
Lieutenant Governor, that sundry persons throughout the
Coal Districts, in various parts of this Province, have dug and mined
and are digging and mining Coals, as well within the bounds of
granted Lands as upon ungranted Lands, without Licence first had
and obtained from the Crown;

And whereas such digging and mining is contrary to law, and in
violation of the terms of the Civil List Act;

Now know ye, That all persons are hereby expressly enjoined
forthwith to desist from such illegal digging and mining, under the
pain of being prosecuted therefor as the Law directs, and of having
the Coal and other Minerals thus mined and dug, seized and taken
into the hands of the Crown. And all persons who shall have dug
and mined Coal without Licence prior to the issuing of this Pro-
clamation, are hereby required forthwith to render an account to
the Provincial Secretary of the quantity of Coal or other Minerals
so dug or mined, in order that the Government may deal therewith
as to them shall seem meet; and all persons neglecting or refusing
so to do within a reasonable time after notice of this Proclamation,
will be liable to be prosecuted: of which all persons whom it doth
or may concern are hereby required to take notice and govern
themselves accordingly.

HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY.

The following were adopted as Standing Rules in the Session
of 1851:—

37th.—That no Bill of a private nature, or Petition for money
or relief, shall be received by the House after the fourteenth day
from the opening of the Session, both inclusive; and that the Clerk
of this House do, one month previous to the meeting of the Legis-

lature, cause fifty printed copies of this Rule to be sent to each of
the Clerks of the Peace in the several Counties for distribution,
and cause the same to be inserted in the Royal Gazette, and two
Newspapers in such County where Newspapers are published.

38th.—That this House will sustain no application for allowances
to Teachers of Common or Parish Schools, unless it shall be certi-
fied by at least two Trustees of Schools for the Parish where such
School has been taught, shewing the time actually taught—the
Teacher to be licenced—the cause why such Teacher was not cer-
tified to the Sessions in the ordinary way—and that such Teacher
was not compelled to discontinue his or her School on account of
any improper conduct.
