WHEREAS the Lieutenant Governor of Her Majesty's Province of New Brunswick, with the Council and Assembly of the said Province, did in the month of April, 1852, pass an Act, which has been transmitted, entitled as follows, viz :—

No. 2144. An Act to exclude certain persons from serving as Members of the Legislative Council in this Province.

And whereas the said Act has been referred to the Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council appointed for the consideration of all matters relating to Trade and Foreign Plantations, and the said Committee have reported as their opinion to Her Majesty, that the said Act should not receive Her Majesty's Royal confirmation; Her Majesty was thereupon this day pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to declare Her disallowance of the said Act, and the same is hereby disallowed accordingly: Whereof the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Commander in Chief for the time being, of Her Majesty's Province of New Brunswick, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice, and govern themselves accordingly.

WHEREAS the Lieutenant Governor of Her Majesty's Province of New Brunswick, with the Council and Assembly of the said Province, did in the months of February, March, and April, 1852, pass seventy seven Acts, which have been transmitted, entitled as follows, viz :—

No. 2149. An Act to appropriate a part of the Public Revenue for the payment of the Ordinary Services of the Province.

No. 2150. An Act to repeal an Act intituled an Act to regulate the Printing and Distribution of the Acts of Assembly.

No. 2151. An Act to continue an Act for the better prevention of Trespasses on Crown Lands and Private Property.

No. 2152. An Act to amend the Law relating to Lunatics and Insane Persons.

No. 2153. An Act in further amendment of the Law relating to the Registry of Deeds and other Instruments.

No. 2154. An Act to annex the Territory awarded to this Province by the New Brunswick and Canadian Arbitrators in the recent settlement of the Boundary question between the Provinces of New Brunswick and Canada, to the Counties of Victoria and Restigouche, and to alter the present Boundary Line between those Counties.

No. 2155. An Act to establish the Road leading from Edmundston, in the Parish of Madawaska, in the County of Victoria, to the River Saint Francis, as one of the Great Roads of communication.

No. 2156. An Act to continue an Act to incorporate the New Brunswick Society for the encouragement of Agriculture, Home Manufactures and Commerce throughout the Province, and to regulate and provide for the same; also an Act to alter and amend the said Act.

No. 2157. An Act to legalize the Lock-up House at the Creek Village, in the Parish of Woodstock, in the County of Carleton.

No. 2158. An Act in further amendment of an Act intituled an Act for the better extinguishing of Fires which may happen in the City of St. John.

No. 2159. An Act to provide for the erecting and making certain Wharves and improvements in the Harbour of Saint John.

No. 2160. An Act to continue and amend an Act intituled an Act for the better extinguishing of Fires which may happen in the City of Saint John.

No. 2161. An Act to authorise the Justices of the Peace for the City and County of Saint John to assess a portion of the inhabitants thereof for a loss sustained by Margaret Griffin in consequence of a Fire in Portland, in September in the year 1851.

No. 2162. An Act to amend an Act to provide for the laying down of Common Sewers in the City of Saint John.

No. 2163. An Act for the better extinguishing of Fires which may happen in the Parish of Portland, in the County of Saint John.

No. 2164. An Act to provide for the erection of a Building for a Registry Office in the City and County of Saint John.
