WHEREAS in consequence of His Excellency Sir EDMUND WALKER HEAD, Baronet, the Lieutenant Governor of the said Province, having this day left the same for England, under leave from Her Most Gracious Majesty, the administration of the Government of the Province has devolved upon me by virtue of, and under Her Majesty's Royal Commission and Instructions, I do accordingly, by this my Proclamation, give Public Notice unto Her Majesty's Subjects in this Province, and all others whom it doth or may concern, that I have this day taken and subscribed the necessary Oaths, and entered upon the duties of the Office, as Administrator of the Government of the Province and its Dependencies.

Given under my Hand and Seal, at Fredericton, this tenth day of May, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty two, and in the fifteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign.
