In submitting to the Subscribers the above account, the Committee beg to state that during the past year, the Medical Officer has prescribed in more than 125 cases, many of which required his attendance at the houses of the patients. In instances where proper sustenance was found more requisite than medicine, Beef and Wine have been supplied. For extra services, in several long and tedious cases, the sum of £5 10s. has been paid. The Committee wish to acknowledge their grateful sense of the kind attention and gratuitous services of Dr. Toldervy.

Although the amount of contributions this year has been small, the Committee trust that the most urgent and deserving cases have received attention and relief. To the very indigent, who are objects of parochial care, the Dispensary does not profess to extend aid. It would afford means of alleviation from suffering and recovery from illness to a class of persons most deserving of sympathy, who could not, in case of distress, be sent to the Commissioner for the Poor. For such an object, the Committee trust, earnest solicitation will not be required to obtain the small amount which each year may be required.
